WINTER SCHOOL

The Winter School at Jacobs University is an annual academic program that takes place during the January intersession and invites students from around the world to join the international Jacobs community on its beautiful residential campus. Social sciences and humanities courses, which range from politics and arts to methodology, are taught by international faculty from Jacobs University and its partner institutions.

Previous courses included:

- German Politics and Culture
- Human Trafficking: An International Perspective
- Intercultural Competence (in cooperation with Inter Cultur gGmbH, a subsidiary of American Field Study Germany, www.intercultur.de)

Students can earn up to 5 ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer System) at both undergraduate and graduate level. An official transcript is provided at the end of the program so that credits can be transferred to the home institutions.

REGISTRATION

The Winter School is open to applicants currently enrolled as undergraduate and graduate students, as well as exceptionally qualified secondary school graduates. Research associates are also welcome to attend the methods courses.

Students who wish to take part in Jacobs University's Winter School must hand in their application by October 31 for the following January.

ABOUT BREMEN

Jacobs University is based in the north of Bremen – a city with a maritime atmosphere and 1,200 years of history.
